Monardella villosa



General Information

- Sun Exposure: Full sun, part shade
- <u>Water Needs</u>: Very low
- Cold Tolerance: Tolerates cold to 15 degrees Fahrenheit
- Flowering Time: Summer

Planting Guide

- <u>Propagating</u>: Rootball division
- <u>Growing from seed</u>: Seed requires no treatment
- Location: Grows well on a mound or slope for better soil drainage
- <u>Soil Description</u>: Tolerates a variety of soils including sand, clay, and serpentine soil. Soil pH of 5.0-7.0
- <u>Initial Watering</u>: Water once when planted and then deep water after one week. Next, deep water every 2-4 weeks as needed

Care Guide

- <u>Irrigation</u>: Does not require irrigation. Will produce more flowers and bloom for longer if watered max 2 times per month in the summer once established. Deep water infrequently (2-4 weeks) to encourage a deep root system that will better tolerate drought.
- <u>Pruning</u>:
 - Prune by 1/3rd in the fall or winter
 - Deadhead spent flowers
- <u>Fertilizer</u>: Not required

Additional Notes

- The leaves can be steeped into a mint tea
- Supports butterflies if planted in sun
- Susceptible to aphids, whiteflies, and rust but is a hardy plant and unlikely to deteriorate if placed in full sun with good drainage
