General Information

- Edible berries; good for jam, jelly or syrup
- Sun Exposure: Part Shade, Full Sun
- Water needs: Low moisture, regular watering to drought tolerant
- Cold Tolerance: Tolerates cold to 10° F
- Days to harvest:

Planting Guide

- <u>Propagation</u>: can be done either from cuttings or seeds, though cuttings are more reliably to bear fruit; should be done mid to late summer or later in summer
- Location: Likes shady locations; deer resistant

- <u>Irrigation</u>: Once established it is drought tolerant, but flowering and fruiting is better with occasional watering during dry weather
