

“Coral Champagne” Cherry

Prunus avium “Coral Champagne



General Information

- Edible
- Sun Exposure: Full Sun
- Water needs: Deep soak when soil is dry. Give extra moisture going into Winter.
- Cold Tolerance: -10 °F - 20 °F
- Chill Requirement: 400 hours
- Harvest season: Mid May - Mid June

Planting Guide

- Location: Sunny location with well drained soil and good air circulation.
- Time of Year: Plant in late fall to early spring when the ground is soft and wet.
- Pollination: Coral Champagne Cherries requires cross pollination to produce fruit. Bing Cherries work best.
- Water needs: Keep soil constantly wet for the first year.

Care Guide

- Harvesting: Birds often prove to be a problem with cherry trees. Covering the tree with bird netting during harvest season can help maximize the crop.
- Mulching: A layer of mulch around the tree will keep roots moist and cool.
- Pruning: Prune yearly in late winter to encourage new growth. Do not prune in the fall.
